COSHOCTON COUNTY JUNIOR FAIR CHANGES

SCHEDULE CHANGE

- Junior Fair Swine Show start time listed at 1:00 p.m. (or after Llama Show).
- Move General Livestock Judging Contest to 3 p.m. on Saturday with registration at 2 p.m. and awards at 7:30 p.m.

HORSE SHOW

- PAS Show for State Fair Selection on Friday, June 27, 6:30 p.m., Hunter Arena
- Evaluation & Skillathon on August 13, Grace United Methodist Church.
- Open Horse Show on Sunday, September 7, 12:30 p.m., Hunter Arena

Class Changes

- Move Small Fry and Stick Pony Classes earlier in show following Showmanship Classes providing an earlier time frame for young children.
- Add Contest Trail Class - Exhibitor 9-18 Horse or Pony
- Add Freestyle Musical Driving Class - Exhibitor 9-18 Horse or Pony

POULTRY SHOW

- Skillathon Evaluations on August 12, Grace United Methodist Church
- Poultry Bloodtesting on September 6, Junior Fair Arena. Separate table for banding and collecting 25 cents on September 6 and at the fair.
- Poultry Barn Cleanup and Set Up Cages on September 13.

Rule Changes

- Market Chickens and Market Ducks hatched on or after August 6th (previously August 9th), the current year, with ownership into the Extension Office by August 23rd, the current year.
- All Market Ducks must be purchased through the Extension Office and permanently identified from the hatchery in order to exhibit in the Junior Fair Poultry Show. Each Market Duck exhibitor must initially purchase at least five Market Ducks.

- Small Animal Evaluations on Thursday, July 24th, County Services Building

DOG SHOW

- Dog Interview Evaluations on Thursday, July 24th, County Services Building

RABBIT SHOW

- Rabbit Skillathon Evaluations on Saturday, August 2nd, Educational Building, Fairgrounds.

Rule Change

- Delete rule #7 - Rabbit breeding classes must have three less than three animals are entered in a specific buck or doe class, then these animals will show in All Other Breeds.

Class Changes

- Add Satin breed classes for both bucks and does.
- Delete Florida White breed classes for both bucks and does.
- All Other Breeds Doe Class and All Other Breeds Buck Class are only for breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association.
- Mixed Breed Doe Class and Mixed Breed Buck Class are for crossbred rabbits and breeds not recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association.

GOAT SHOWS

- Goat Clinic on April 12th, 9 a.m. - 12 noon
- Goat Skillathon Evaluations on Monday, July 28th, Educational Building, Fairgrounds Preview Goat Show on Saturday, August 23rd, 1 p.m. Junior Fair Arena.
- 2008 Junior Fair Goat Show order on Saturday is: Fun Classes, Pack, Meat, Pygmy, Dairy, and Angora.
- Market Wether goats must be tagged on June 28th, 10-10:30 a.m. at the Open Class Sheep Barn. All other wether goats (Agora wether, Pygmy wether, or Dairy wether) wishing to sell in the Junior Fair Auction must be tagged on June 28th, 10-10:30 a.m. at the Open Class Sheep Barn.

Rule Changes

- For tagging wether goats at the designated Market Wether Goat Tag Day in June, all wethers must have no horns (except Pygmies and Angoras) or testicular tissue to be officially tagged in.

Class Changes

- Beginner Goat Pack Class - Remove word "exhibitor" from first sentence of class description. First sentence read, "Class is available for goats that have not been shown in pack classes before at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Goat Show."

DAIRY SHOW

- Dairy Skillathon on Tuesday, July 22nd, County Services Building
- 2008 Show Order: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, and Milking Shorthorn.

Rule Changes

- Junior Division Dairy Classes - If there are four or less calves or heifers in a breed, these animals are all brought into the ring at the same time for judging.
- Senior Division Dairy Classes - If there are four or less in a breed, these animals are all brought into the ring at the same time for judging.

SHEEP SHOW

- Market Lamb Weigh Days is one day on Friday, June 20, 6-7:30 p.m. at the Fairgrounds
- Preview Sheep Show on Saturday, August 23rd, Junior Fair Arena
- Sheep Skillathon & Evaluation on Thursday, August 14th, Educational Building, Fairgrounds
- Senior Fair Board added a Pee Wee Showmanship. Kecia Buxton offered her help.

Rule Changes

- Market Lamb class weight ranges be printed in the Junior Fair Sheep Show Book.

- Market Lamb exhibitors must designate at the fair weigh-in which lambs are to be shown as single market lambs and which lambs will be in the Pen of Two. The average weight of the Pen of Two lambs will be used to break the classes for Pen of Two.

BEEF SHOW

- Beef Skillathon Evaluation on Thursday, August 14th, Fairgrounds
- Beef Preview Show on Saturday, August 23rd, Hunter Arena
- Feeder Calf Tag Day on Saturday, June 21st, 7-9 a.m., Fairgrounds

Rule Change

- Allow Junior Fair Beef Cattle and Dairy Cattle have the option to haul animals into the Fairgrounds on Thursday evening before fair starting at 5 p.m. if the exhibitor wishes. No other Junior Fair Livestock are allowed to be hauled in Thursday evening.
- Market Steer and Market Beef class weight ranges be printed in the Junior Fair Beef Show Book.

Recommendations

- Designate a pathway from the driveway to the back of Hunter Arena between the lower side of the new Junior Fair Beef Barn and the 4-H eating tent.
- Lighting is needed for this pathway area from the driveway to the back of Hunter Arena.
- Lighting is needed on the back side of the new Junior Fair Beef Barn.

SWINE SHOW

- Market Hog Tag Day on Saturday, June 28th, 6-8 a.m. behind Junior Fair Arena.
- Swine Skillathon Evaluation, August 18th, Educational Building, Fairgrounds

Rule Changes

- Market Gilt and Market Barrow class weight ranges be printed in the Junior Fair Swine Show Book.
- Change minimum weight limit for market gilts and market barrows to 230 pounds (previously 220 pounds). Market gilts and market barrows not meeting the 230 pound minimum limit will not be eligible for Champion or allowed to sell in the auction.
- All market livestock must be brought to the designated Weigh Day/Tag Day location to be eligible to exhibit in the Junior Fair shows.
- Any Market Beef, Market Lamb, Market Gilt, or Market Barrow exhibitor not wishing to show in the Carcass Show and Champion Drive, must notify the show advisor before the animals enter the ring for Champion Drive. Final placings of these market Champion Drives must go to the Carcass Show. For the Junior Hog Show, the exhibitors not wishing to show in the Champion Drive for Market Gilt or Champion drive for Market Barrow must decide and notify a show advisor before these two Champion Drives or 12 animals begin. Final placings of the top 16 overall Market Hogs must go to the Carcass Show.

Recommendations

- Notify swine exhibitors of the time for taking auction pictures by posting signs on the hog pens.
- Market classes be broken by consensus of a Junior Fair Director, show advisor, and that specific livestock representative.

- Additional buy-bidders be contacted for placing bids on the market hogs and other market livestock.
- Announcer at the Junior Fair Swine Show needs to explain more about what is happening during the show.
- Buildings need more ventilation (Swine Barn) and more hog pens are needed. (Big fans like at state fair would be great.)

Rule Change

NOT PREVIOUSLY INCLUDED RULE CHANGE

- Modeling Review – to make **non-competitive**. Rule 1 – Any 4-H member may enter this non-competitive event. \$1 premium if narration is turned into the office of the Youth Building by noon of Modeling Review day. (Previously \$1.00 premium if narration is turned in by previous Monday.)
- Rule 3 to read: Participants will be modeling the “Total Look”, Seven Clues of Fashion, etc. (Previously, Models will be evaluated on the “The Total Look”, Seven Clues of Fashion, etc,
- Rule 4 to read: All participants will receive a special ribbon.

Class Change

- Modeling Review Class 1 - Junior - 8 and in 3rd grade - 11, 4-H Age (previously 9-11 years old, 4-H Age)

SPECIAL INTEREST

- 4-H Evaluation Days on July 14 and 21 at the Coshocton County Career Center.
- Shooting Sports, Gun Safety, and Basic Archery to be evaluated on the second Evaluation Day on July 21st at the Coshocton Career Center.

-For the rule about attending the designated Weigh Day/Tag Day, the Senior Fair Board voted the rule to remain the same as stated in the fair book: page 63-Rule 50: *“The purpose of the Weigh-Ins (and Tag Days) is to insure ownership on the designated ownership day. If an exhibitor’s animal is not at the Weigh-In(Tag Day) due to a crisis, then a Junior Fair Director or the Extension Educator/FFA Instructor must be spoken to the day of the specie’s Weigh-In or Tag Day. The directors and organization’s leader must decide if the animal is an eligible Junior Fair exhibit.”*
