The 4-H Camp Ohio Youth Education Center is nestled along the Rocky Fork Stream approximately ten miles east of Utica, Ohio. It is situated on more than 500 acres in the beautiful rolling hills of northern Licking County. Approximately 8,000 youth and adults camp annually.

What activities are at camp?

Some favorite activities for the week include; archery, riflery, creaking, trapshooting, hiking, fishing, dances, cookouts, pioneer life, launching rockets, campfires, swimming, zipping, skits, canoeing, tug of war, water slide, and living history.

High Ropes: Positioned 25 feet high among the trees, 4-H Camp Ohio's High Ropes course consists of 16 different elements. Each participant is fitted with a climbing harness and helmet. Elements consist of single or partner challenges to push participants to their limit. The highlight of the course consists of a 400 foot zip line ride across one of the many valleys at 4-H Camp Ohio. There is a fee of \$20 per participant. Participants must be 12 years or older.

Consider making a **camp lamp** this year. The cost of the lamp is \$6.00 and includes a lamp kit and shade. The Frontier Power Company pays for the remainder of lamp cost. The fee must be paid to the Extension Office before camp. Only 24 lamp kits available so first come, first served.



Team Challenge: The team challenge consists of 12 low ropes elements. These elements provide opportunities for small groups to cooperatively decide on a solution to a carefully designed problem and then carry out their plan of action as quickly and efficiently as possible. Designed for participants 9 years of age and older.

Living History: Participants may experience Amish Life by visiting a working Amish Farm, see the 4-H Camp Ohio Farm which consists of 80 acres, Native American by visiting the tipi, or pioneer while visiting the authentic pioneer cabin. Campers can also receive a living history award for participating in a total of six hours of living history classes.

Adventure Tower: Experience the adventure tower by participating in one, two, or all three activities including a 38-foot climbing wall, 350-foot zip line and a 30-foot repelling wall. Each participant is fitted with a climbing harness and helmet. A three-person back-up belay system is used for both zip line and climbing wall. No age requirement but participants must be able to fit in harness.

Why Should my child attend 4-H Camp

At camp, your son/daughter will: learn new skills and develop new interests, have recreation and educational experiences in outdoor living away from home, have the responsibility for their own actions and decisions without constant family protection, learn to live, work and play with others, and learn to understand and appreciate nature.

Who can attend?

Any youth, boy or girl, from 8 years old and in the third grade on Jan. 1 of the current camp year may attend camp. Youth in 7th grade as of January 1st are last year campers.

Where is Camp Ohio?

4-H Camp Ohio is located in Licking County (11461 Camp Ohio Road, St. Louisville, OH 43071) near Utica (map available). The camp consists of approximately 200 acres of trees, flowers, hiking trails, and a stream and pond for nature studies. Other facilities include cabins, dining hall, swimming pool, recreation building, craft pavilion, leadership hall, and a multi-purpose building. What are health and safety features at camp?

Every camper is protected by accident insurance while at camp. In addition, a camp nurse is in residence at camp 24 hours a day, as is permanent staff, county adult staff, and an extension professional.

How much is the camp fee and what does it cover?

The camp fee is \$135 per camper, 4-H member or non-4-H member. It covers meals, lodging, insurance, crafts, group picture of all campers, and scheduled snacks. Camp fee does not cover souvenirs or food purchased at the camp store.
