### 2022 LIVESTOCK AUCTION INFORMATION

The Friends of the Coshocton County Jr. Fair Livestock Auction committee is now accepting donations for the 2022 Coshocton County Jr. Fair Livestock Auction. This is a great way for those who have not been involved as buyers in recent years, want to support the auction but are not comfortable or not able to bid in person, or those who participated in Jr. Fair events in the past that would like a way give back to the current group of youth through this buyer pool. Last year we collected over \$10,000 and were able to help 55 youth during the auction or after the auction through add-ons. The funds donated to the buyer pool are used to bid, or add-on to bids for the Jr. Fair Livestock Auction. Animals that look to be sold at lower than average price for the sale are the focus. Contributors to this fund will be listed after the fair in local media outlets. ### 4-H FOOD STAND INFORMATION

The 4-H Food Stand will once again be serving this year at the fair! You can find the food stand in Hunter Arena. Each club takes a turn serving in the food stand during the fair. Proceeds from the food stand go directly to the 4-H Advisory which budgets money each year towards these things: 4-H Camp Scholarships (\$5500), Adult Awards HOF (the plaques in the youth building), Evaluation Days/Skillathon/Banner Club (The food that is provided to all the helpers as well as many awards and fair tickets), Horse Committee (judge for our PAS state fair tryouts), 4-H Promotion (during 4-H Week and more), Shooting Sports, 4-H Camp Ohio, Youth Support (Ohio 4-H Conference and more). All proceeds go directly back into our county 4-H program so please stop by Hunter Arena during the fair and support 4-H! **Sign-ups for shifts are first come first serve after banner clubs.**
