1. This department is open to exhibitors enrolled in 4-H You and Your Dog, Pilot Puppy, or Obedience Training or a program through one of the Junior Fair organizations.
2. Dogs in heat will not be exhibited.
3. Dogs will only remain at the fair during the actual show and will be confined with their owner while on the fairgrounds.
4. All exhibitors shall have available for examination at the beginning of the show, a current dog license and certificates of current parvo, rabies and distemper, Adenovirus (CAV-1 & CAV-2), Leptospirosis and Parainfluenza (CPI) vaccinations administered by a veterinarian. All dog exhibitors must have either an ODA official health certificate or the certificate of vaccination for the 4-H Dog Show Project available for examination at the beginning of the Dog Show.
5. Each exhibitor shall provide his own leash, water dish, cage and other equipment needed.
6. Exhibitors must enter level A if the handler or dog were NOT previously in this class or have shown in this class in other shows. (AKC or UKC sanctioned shows or sanctioned show matches.)
7. Exhibitors must enter level B if the handler or the dog were previously entered in this class or have shown in this class in other shows
8. Dog project must be in the care of the Junior Fair exhibitor and enrolled as a project by June 1 of the current year (except members enrolled in the Pilot Puppy Program which begins at the time of the placement of the puppy).
9. A dog may be entered in Obedience, Showmanship and conformation classes.
10. The judge may excuse a dog that attacks another dog or that appears dangerous to other dogs in the ring.
11. You and Your Dog classes include Member Interview (Questions asked from the You and Your Dog 201D project book.); Dog Project and Record Book; Members' Appearance and Attitude; Dog's Appearance and Manners; and Creative Achievement of Member and Dog (Exhibitor must show something that he or she did with or for his or her dog during the current project year. This could include, but is not limited to tricks, costumes, or dog clothing made, scrapbooks, or posters). Youth must bring their dogs to You and Your Dog judging.
12. Showmanship judging includes an interview, handler appearance and attitude, grooming, handling and group examination.
13. Beginner Novice Obedience classes require exhibitor to demonstrate the ability of the animal to heel on lead, figure eight on lead, sit for exam on lead, sit stay (leash attached, on ground), and recall off leash.
14. Pre-Novice Obedience classes require exhibitor to demonstrate the ability of the animal to heel on leash, figure eight on leash, recall on leash, long sit on leash, and long down on leash.
15. Novice Obedience Classes require exhibitor to demonstrate the ability to heel on leash, figure eight, stand for examination, heel free, recall, long sit, and long down.
16. Advanced Obedience classes can be up to the judge's discretion but can require exhibitor to demonstrate ability to heel on leash, figure eight off leash, drop on recall, dumbbell recall (exhibitor provides dumbbell), long down, heel free, long sit, and long down.
17. Exhibitor may enter one dog in an obedience class, 1 dog in a showmanship class, and 1 dog in the conformation class.
18. A qualifying ribbon will be awarded to all exhibitors who obtain a qualifying score. A participation ribbon will be awarded to those who do not qualify. Four placings will be presented in each obedience class.
19. Progression of Obedience classes is as follows:
 - a. Beginner Novice A – One year then move to Beginner Novice B or Pre-Novice (Beginner

Novice A class can never be repeated by handler OR dog)

- b. Beginner Novice B – can repeat class with same dog or different dog unless previously received a score of 175 points or above out of the total 230 point scorecard. Once the qualifying score has been reached, exhibitor and dog must move to Pre-Novice or Novice.
 - c. Pre-Novice – Can repeat class with same or different dog unless exhibitor received 175 or above points out of 230 points, OR can show in Beginner Novice B until exhibitor received 175 points out of 230 points on scorecard. Once receiving score of 175 or above out of 230 points possible in both Beginner Novice B and Pre-Novice, exhibitor must move into Novice Classes.
 - d. Novice A – One year, then move to Novice B (Novice A class can never be repeated by handler OR dog).
 - e. Novice B – can repeat class with same dog or different dog until exhibitor receives a score of 175 or above out of 230 points.
 - f. Advanced Obedience – can repeat this class with same dog regardless of winning
20. Vaccination papers for dogs are due to the OSU Extension Office by September 1st.

Book 630 - OBEDIENCE

- _____ 1 – Beginner Novice A, neither exhibitor nor dog as had any prior obedience experience
- _____ 2 – Beginner Novice B, Exhibitor or dog has previously shown in Beginner Novice A or has had experience at the Beginner Novice level. Youth may show one project dog in Beginner Novice B OR Pre-Novice, decided upon according to skill level and preference.
- _____ 3 – Pre-Novice, Exhibitor or dog has previously shown in Beginner Novice A or has had experience at the beginner Novice B OR Pre-Novice, decided upon according to skill level and preference.
- _____ 4 – Novice A, Neither exhibitor nor dog has had any prior experience at the Novice level.
- _____ 5 – Novice B, Exhibitor or dog that has shown in Novice A or has had experience at the Novice level.
- _____ 6 – Advanced Obedience, Exhibitor or dogs that have previously received qualifying scores in Novice B, or exhibitors that choose to compete at this level.

Book 631 – CONFORMATION DOG

- _____ 1 – Exhibitor 8-18 years of age and enrolled in You and Your Dog Project. Exhibitor must be able to bench or stack dog for the judge. Exhibitor must gait dog for the judge.

Book 632 – COSTUME CLASS

- _____ 1 – Exhibitor 8-18 years of age.

Book 629 – YOU AND YOUR DOG

- _____ 1 – First Year – Exhibitor 9-11 years of age as of January 1 of current year with no Junior Fair Dog Show experience. Not eligible for Classes 2 or 3
- _____ 2 – Junior You and Your Dog, Exhibitor 9-11 years of age as of January 1 of current year.
- _____ 3 – Intermediate and Senior You and Your Dog, Exhibitor 12-18 years of age as of January 1 of current year.

Book 412– SHOWMANSHIP

- _____ 1 – Junior A, Exhibitors must be 8-13 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. Neither exhibitor nor dog has had any prior experience in dog showmanship
- _____ 2 – Junior B, Exhibitors must be 8-13 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. Exhibitor or dog has been previously shown in Showmanship Junior A or prior showmanship experience.
- _____ 3 – Senior A, Exhibitors must be 14-18 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. Neither exhibitor nor the dog has had any prior experience in dog showmanship.
- _____ 4 – Senior B, Exhibitors must be 14-18 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. Exhibitor or dog has been previously shown in Junior or Senior A, or prior showmanship experience.
- _____ 5 – Supreme Showmanship, winners from classes 1-4 above.
