Auction order is rotated each year. Within each species, auction order is random determined by the computer system, except that Champions always sell first followed by Reserve Champions. Again in 2023, the animals in the champion drive in the market beef, hog, and lamb classes sell at the beginning of their respective species in the order as placed by the judge in the championship class. Each exhibitor will be selling only one animal through the auction ring except if they have more than one Champion.

The 2023 Junior Fair Auction is a partial-terminal auction. Buyers may indicate "Keep" and indicate a processor or take the animal home. Or the buyer may say "Buy-Bid" to send the animal to market and pay the difference between the bid price and the market price listed in the auction catalog.

Listed on the following pages are the weights and buy-bid prices for each of these animals. The buy-bid is the market price placed on the animal during the fair as a guaranteed price by a packer. To purchase an animal you must bid higher than the listed buy-bid price.

Market lambs, hogs, beef, and feeder calves will all be selling by the pound. All other animals in the 2023 auction will continue to be sold by the head.

No animals are to be returned to exhibitors during the auction. That animal is not eligible to be shown by that exhibitor or any other member at any Junior Fair Show. If you wish to return the animal to the exhibitor <u>PERSONALLY</u> outside of the ring or after the auction, please indicate that you are buying the animal as "Keeper". Also inform the cashier when you check out. Auction animals are not eligible to be shown by the selling exhibitor or any other member at another Junior Fair Show.

Individual exhibitors selling their live animal or carcass animal in the auction ring are NOT to announce or display in the auction ring any additional items to give the buyer(s) such as food or gifts.

After purchasing one of these market animals you will receive a buyer rosette for display and an attractive dated picture sign indicating your support of the auction.

Buyers of Champion and Reserve Champion animals will be presented an impressive picture plaque at the Buyers Breakfast to permanently display in their business or homes.

It is <u>important</u> that all buyers who purchase at the auction check at the Jr. Fair Office with the bank clerks before leaving the fairgrounds. Please pay for your purchases the evening of the auction so that exhibitors can be sent their checks in reasonable time. Credit cards will not be a form of payment for auction purchases.

The minimum price for market animals will not be raised due to the changes in the auction computer system and the necessity for extra checks.

Animals sold through the auction must be removed from the fairgrounds on auction night. Once the animal is sold, the Auction Committee is not responsible for the animal.

#### Add-ons

Add-ons for any Junior Fair Auction animal or Supreme Product will be accepted at a table in Hunter Arena (near Information Table) or Junior Fair Arena.

### **Carcass Show Animals**

Again this year, all Champions, Reserve Champions, and the final championship drive of market beef, market hogs, and market lambs will have to go to slaughter for inspection by a state inspector and be part of a carcass show. The Auction Committee has decided to have all these animals slaughtered at Olde Village Meats of Frazeysburg. All exhibitors are invited to view the carcasses Sunday evening following the fair, on October 8<sup>th</sup>, 4:30-6:00 p.m. The explanation of the placings will be at 4:30 p.m.

The buyers of these top animals may either elect to pay the buy-bid price or designate it a keeper and pay the full price. If it's a "Keeper", realize that it will be a carcass that they need to make arrangements to get processed at Olde Village Meats (will not be released for processing at another processor.)

- \*\* All animals sold through the auction are released as sold during the Junior Fair Auction on Thursday evening.
- \*\*Buy-bid hogs, lambs, and cattle that are not in the Carcass Show will be sent auction night to the designated buy-bidder, so it is critical that buyers correctly tell auctioneers if the animal is a keeper or buy-bid.

Make checks payable to: Coshocton County Junior Fair Auction Committee. The Auction Committee is deducting a 4% commission from the selling price of all livestock. A 4½% commission will be deducted for the selling of Champions and Reserve Champion animals and the Goat, Llama, and Dairy Products.
