1. Only dairy goat does must be dehorned.
2. Does need not be registered by should be of a recognized goat breed.
3. Meat does will show by age classes with all dairy breeds combined.
4. Exhibitor may enter 2 market goats and 5 non market goats.
5. There will be supervised milk-out for all production does (except dry does) 5-6pm Friday at he dairy goat barn. Any exhibitor missing the specified milk-out must still milk out the doe(s) sometime prior to the show in the presence of the official milk-out inspector to be eligible to enter the production doe class(es).
6. Dairy goat exhibitors are to wear all white, pack goat exhibitors are to dress for the trail. Other classes must wear appropriate show attire.
7. The best doe of show in each breed will be in the ring for Supreme Goat Product on sale night.
8. It is permissible to use a short lead strap when exhibiting Pygmy goats. The lead strap should only be long enough to allow the exhibitor to stand up straight.
9. Leather collar, nylon collar, pronged collar or standard choker collar are the only types of collars allowed for showing goats.
10. Pygmy Wether and Angora Wether goats are not eligible to sell in the junior fair auction.
11. All wether goats must be castrated by banding or surgically cutting, not clamping. No testicular tissue can be present at fair time.
12. All market goats entered in the same class will be broken by weight if necessary. Minimum weight requirement is 45 pounds. Underweight goats will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion.
13. All entries in the Market goat classes must be ear tagged and weighed upon check in.
14. Champion and Reserve Champion Market Goat must be sold in the Junior Fair Auction
15. Market Goats born before January 1 of the current year are not eligible to sell.
16. All market goats must be tagged on June 24, 10-10:30am. Each exhibitor may tag a maximum of 3 market goats. Wethers must be surgically cut or

banded and have scrapie tag identification on the tag in day.

17. All goats must have scrapie identification and/or tattoo paperwork checked prior to unloading at the fairgrounds. If goats are microchipped, exhibitor must bring their own reader.
18. Exhibitors must attend Quality Assurance.
19. Goat Product: The goat product is for any exhibitor entering a goat in the junior fair. Exhibitor must not be selling any other animal in the Jr. Fair Auction. Exhibitors get one unit for each goat entered with a maximum of four. Showmanship classes do not count. The total amount the goat product and add-ons receive at the auction will be divided by the total number of units. Members must confirm during the fair at the Jr. Fair Office the total number of units requested. Also, members must check the auction book for confirmation of total units.
20. Exhibitors may only compete with one animal in showmanship and must not change animals if they advance classes.

PACK CLASSES - 574

_____ 1 – Beginner Goat Pack Class, class is available for goats that have not been shown in pack classes before at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Goat Show. Goat must wear a pack and exhibitors should wear proper attire for trail. Class counts as a goat entry.

_____ 2 – Experienced Goat Pack Class, class for all goats that have been shown in a pack class before at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Goat Show. Goat must wear a pack and exhibitors should wear proper attire for trail. Goat and exhibitors will complete an obstacle course. Class counts as a goat entry.

MARKET GOAT SHOW – 575

_____ 1 – Dairy, Meat, and Meat Cross Goat. Dairy, Boer, Spanish, Kiko, Tennessee Meat Goat, or Meat Crosses born after January 1 of the current year.

_____ 2 – Home Bred, Born, and Raised Market Goat. Exhibitor or Exhibitors family is to own or have the doe bred that procures the market goat. The exhibitor is not to purchase a bred doe to produce the market goat for this class (must also be the exhibitor’s book 575 – Class 1 entry)

All does of Boer, Spanish, Kiko, Tennessee, Meat Goat or Meat Crosses.

_____ 1 – Meat Junior Kid Doe, born April 1 – June 1, current year

_____ 2 – Meat Senior Kid Doe, born January 1 – March 31, current year

_____ 3 – Meat Adult Doe, 12-35 months as of the fair and has not kidded

_____ 4 – Meat Adult Doe, born before January 1 of the current year and has kidded

_____ 5 – Dam and Daughter, daughter must be born in the current year

PYGMY WETHER GOAT SHOW – 577

_____ 1 – Junior Wether Goat, born on or after April 1, current year.

_____ 2 – Senior Wether Goat, born January 1 – March 31, current year

_____ 3 – Adult Pygmy Wether, born before January 1, current year

PYGMY GOAT SHOW – 578

_____ 1 – Pygmy Junior Kid Doe, born April 1 – June 1, current year

_____ 2 – Pygmy Senior Kid Doe, born January 1 – March 31, current year

_____ 3 – Pygmy Adult Doe, 12-35 months, has no kids

_____ 4 – Pygmy Adult Doe, all other adult pygmy does not in class 3

_____ 5 – Dam and Daughter, daughter must be born in the current year

ALL OTHER BREEDS – 579

_____ 1 – Breed Class, open to all does and wethers that are not eligible to compete as a dairy, meat, or pygmy goat.

_____ 1 – Junior Kid Doe, born April 1 – June 1, current year

_____ 2 – Senior kid doe, born Jan. 1 – March 31, current year

_____ 3 – Junior & Senior Yearling Dry Doe, never been freshened. Born before Jan. 1 current year, and under two years

_____ 4 – Dairy Production Does, Dairy production does should be in milk. First place exhibitor in the dairy production class will be in the sale ring with his/her goat during the selling of the supreme goat product.

_____ 5 – Dam and Daughter, daughter must be born in the current year.

ANGORA DOES – 583

_____ 1 – Angora Kid Doe, born after January 1, current year

_____ 2 – Angora Adult Doe, born before January 1, current year

_____ 3 – Dam and Daughter, daughter must be born in the current year

ANGORA WETHERS – 584

_____ 1 – Angora Kid Wether, born after January 1 of the current year

_____ 2 – Angora Adult Wether, born before January 1 of current year (Not eligible to sell in Junior Fair Auction)

_____ 1 – Senior Showmanship 17 & 18

_____ 2 – Senior Showmanship 15 & 16
