Scrapie Tag information – VERY IMPORTANT

- **Reminder: (Coshocton County Fair Requirement)** All goats must be scrapie tagged, tattooed or micro-chipped before entering the fairgrounds. Goats will be checked as they come in the front gate, so please enter through the front gate. If they do not have a scrapie tag they must be tattooed with original registration papers, if micro-chipped you must provide a reader.
- **Scrapie Tagging: (State Requirement)** Any doe goat (adult or kid) arriving at the fair must have a Scrapie ID tag from the breeder, Scrapie ID tattoo number, or an association tattoo in the ear & be accompanied by the association registration paper. - Blue tags are slaughter only tags.
- **NEW THIS YEAR – If your goats do not have the scrapie tag on Thursday of weigh-ins then they will not be permitted to weigh in & your goat will leave the fairgrounds IMMEDIATELY! This also includes goats that are tattooed or microchipped! We had too many problems with this last year!**

General knowledge & selection of your goat, what a judge at the fair is looking for in judging you as well as your animal, hoof trimming & general grooming, as well as what items need filled out in your book. The skillathon will be available for practice if you would like to test your skills.

August 10th from 9-11am at the Jr. Fair Arena is the Goat Preview Show. Bring your goat & learn how to show for the fair as well as how to get your goat ready for the fair.

September 26th Goat check in at the Fairgrounds all goats will need to be weighed by the open sheep arena. At this time, the DNF forms will be filled out as well as what you are planning to sell. Please be sure to have your scrapie tag already on your goats. If you are not weighing in this night scrapie will still be checked!

September 26th Barn Meeting for all goat & sheep participants even if you are not weighing in prior to weigh-in!

September 27th Goat Milk out for any dairy goats in your own pens starting at 6:00pm be sure to check with Analea Smith once your goat is milked out.

September 28th Goat Show at the Jr. Fair Arena starting at 4:00pm
